

## Transfer Station Permit Information

Open to Woodstock residents disposing of household trash originating in Woodstock ONLY.

For Safety: All loads MUST be covered and secured during transit to prevent litter & accidents.

**Purchase Permits at Town Hall** Town Clerk Judy Walberg (860-928-0208 x320) issues permits during regular business hours. Annual sticker renewal begins on January 2. ***You must present vehicle registration at time of purchase. Checks are to be made payable to "Town of Woodstock."***

### Types of Permits Available

- Woodstock Single Family Household .....\$220  
Residents of multi-unit dwellings must purchase a sticker for their own unit. Sticker cost is half price beginning September 1.
- Woodstock Seniors (65 or older) .....\$125  
Senior sticker issued ONLY when the majority of residents generating trash from the household are age 65 or older. Sticker cost is half price beginning September 1.
- Woodstock Business .....\$220  
Recyclables generated in Woodstock ONLY — *No Bulky, Trash, or Brush*. Permit cost is half price beginning September 1.
- One Day Pass .....\$35

***Passes must be surrendered on the day of use and expire within 30 days of issue. Five passes maximum per 30 days, per household.***

- » Residents who have not purchased a yearly sticker must pay \$35, present proof of residence with name and address (driver's license or mail), and vehicle registration for the vehicle that will be used.
- » Residents who have purchased a yearly sticker, but need to temporarily use a different vehicle, must present vehicle registration (for the vehicle that will be used) to receive a one day pass at no cost.
- » May be obtained at Transfer Station with proper ID and **payable by check only made out to the "Town of Woodstock."**

### **Bulky Waste No opening of railings without attendant present.**

Bulky waste disposal fees are based on weight — heavy loads will cost more for disposal. Bulky items may include, but are not limited to: a large assortment of household junk, "clean" (new, unpainted, unused) wood, empty or dried paint cans, large furniture, large toys, etc. Construction/demolition debris (sheet rock, shingles, and insulation) must not exceed 100 lbs. and must be in a separate container.

**Loads must be assessed by the attendant prior to dumping, or additional fees may be charged. Payment must be made by check payable to "Town of Woodstock" (absolutely no cash or credit cards) at the time of disposal.** A \$15 fee will be charged for checks returned by the bank as unpaid.

**Fee Schedule (Final fees will be determined by attendants after reviewing loads.)**

**The disposal of Demolition Material (in excess of 100 lbs.) is restricted by the DEEP. You will need to make your own arrangements with a private hauler for removal.**

(1) 30 to 55 gallon container**	\$15
(1) small pick-up truck or small trailer load	\$30
(1) mid-sized pick-up truck (1/2, 3/4 ton) or medium trailer load	\$45
(1) 1-ton dump truck or large trailer load	\$70

**\*\*Minimum bulky charge = \$15**

Additional \$10 fee assessed on loads that include demolition or construction debris.

\$6 each for stuffed chairs, \$10 for a sofa/sleeper sofa (if springs are removed)

\$15 each for any appliances with Freon (refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers)

\$75 and up for hot tubs

\$10 and up for rolled carpets (10 x 12)

#### **Tires**

\$6 per car tire  
\$8 per car tire w/rim  
\$12 per R17 tire  
\$18 per R17 tire w/rim  
\$28 per tractor/earth moving tire

#### **Empty Propane Tanks**

\$4 for 20 lb. tank  
\$6 for 40 lb. tank  
\$10 for 100 lb. tank

## Transfer Station Regulations

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### Swap Shed— (10am—3pm) No items after 3pm on Sunday.

- Useable items ONLY — **as defined by attendants.**
- Vehicle loads are subject to same charges as bulky items and must see attendants before unloading.
- NO food items.
- NO broken or unstable items.
- NO computers or televisions.
- NO stuffed chairs, couches or large furniture.
- NO clothing.
- NO air conditioners, refrigerators or dehumidifiers.
- NO items to be left outside of the shed.

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### Brush and Leaves—*No dumping after 3pm.*

- See attendant before offloading your leaves and clean brush under 3” diameter.
- No grass clippings.

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### Woodchips

- Available to residents in limited quantities at no charge.
- Please see the attendant.
- Must be able to load yourself.

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### Refundable Bottles and Cans

- Place in proper recycling area.

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### Paint— *Tuesday, Friday and Saturday morning*

- Products must be in original container with original label.
- Container must be sealed and in good condition with no leaks.
- Containers must be no larger than 5 gallons.
- No spray paints or aerosol cans. (Paint care program only)
- Do not drop off any paint products without seeing an attendant.
- See attendant for list of acceptable products.

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### Mattresses and Box Springs—*No charge to permit and non-permit holders. Non-permit holders may dispose of these items on Saturdays Only and must provide the attendant with proof of residence.*

- Please see the attendant.
  - Please call before coming to confirm there is space available.
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**All Transfer Station regulations are enforced by the attendants, and residents must adhere to their instructions.**

- Proof of vehicle registration in the Town of Woodstock (Tax Code #169) is required with a permit.
- New residents who have not yet registered their vehicle in Woodstock will be issued up to five one day passes. *Passes must be surrendered on the day of use and expire within 30 days of issue.*
- **Permit sticker is assigned to a specific vehicle, its owner/s, and a specific household.** To use another vehicle, please see stipulations of the one day pass (previous page).
- Only day passes issued in 2024 are accepted and must be surrendered to attendant upon entry.
- Permits are NOT refundable.

**Annual Permit Stickers MUST be affixed to driver’s side front windshield or admittance will be denied.**

- Place items in appropriate containers or areas as indicated.
- Bulky loads MUST be assessed by attendant prior to dumping to be sure any additional assessment fees are accurate.

**\* Violations of these regulations may result in loss of transfer station use, including permit revocation.**

**\* The Transfer Station is a one-way facility, please refrain from backing up for any reason!**

**CONTRACTORS / BUSINESS OWNERS may only dispose of their own personal household trash and bulky waste, not from their business.**

**Hazardous waste is NOT accepted at the Transfer Station. The Town participates in hazardous waste collection days—watch for local advertising. Please store the material safely until the collection day is held.**

**Items to be Recycled**

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**Cardboard**

- Brown corrugated boxes ONLY
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**Newspaper/Magazines/Junk Mail**—*White and colored paper including glossy. Tie in bundles or stack in paper grocery bags.*

- Newspapers/flyers/inserts
  - Magazines
  - Catalogs
  - Junk mail
  - Office paper
  - Computer printouts
  - Envelopes (window okay)
  - Paper bags
  - Clean food boxes (no liners)
  - Paper towel/toilet paper rolls
  - Paperback/hardcover books
  - NO plastic bags
  - Shoe Boxes
  - Beer, Soda & Food Containers
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**Tin Cans & Metal Food**—*Rinse well. Labels and lids may be attached.*

- Metal cans
  - Metal lids from jars/bottles
  - Empty aerosol cans
  - NO cooking pots and pans
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**Glass from Food & Drink Containers**

- Clear glass goes in separate container
  - Colored glass goes together
  - NO window glass/auto glass/heat treated glass (Pyrex)
  - NO light bulbs
  - NO mirrors
  - NO ceramics
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**Plastic from Food and Drink Only**—*Check recycling code on item and remove caps before placing in containers.*

- Milk Jugs Bin: plastic milk jugs or similar water/juice jugs.
- Plastic #1 Bin: clear plastic bottles.
- Plastic #2 Bin: colored plastic.
- NO toys
- NO laundry baskets
- NO plant containers
- NO food trays
- NO oil containers
- NO chemical containers
- NO foam
- NO plastic bags
- NO clothes hangers

**\*Waxed Cardboard Milk/Juice Cartons should be disposed of with household trash.**

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**Items Accepted at Transfer Station**

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**Used Motor Oil & Antifreeze**—*Empty containers go in Bulky Waste. Used oil filters go in Recycle Shed.*

- Motor oil
  - Brake fluid
  - Automatic transmission fluid
  - Used oil from internal combustion engines
  - NO cooking oil
  - NO Brake cleaning fluids
  - NO gasoline
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**Batteries**—*Automobile/Truck/Marine Batteries & Rechargeable.*

- Make sure battery cases are not leaking.
  - Household (alkaline, flashlight-type) batteries can be compacted along with normal household trash.
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**Scrap Metal**—*Separate and dispose of in the designated dumpster.*

- Barbecues
  - Water heaters
  - Lawn mowers
  - Iron piping
  - Motors
  - Stoves
  - Metal furniture
  - Washers
  - Dryers
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**Scrap Appliances**—*Place next to attendant's building. Doors from appliances must be removed. \$15 fee to cover Freon removal.*

- Refrigerators
  - Freezers
  - Air conditioners
  - Dehumidifiers
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**Electronic Waste**—*No charge to permit and non-permit holders residing in Woodstock. Non-permit holders may dispose of these items on Saturdays Only.*

- Televisions
  - Computers
  - Printers
  - Monitors
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**Fluorescent Light Bulbs**—*Long and compact spirals.*

- Recycle in the designated containers.
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**Used Clothing**—*There is a drop-off box designated for clothing.*

- Place clothing in plastic bags.
  - Tie pairs of shoes together.
  - Do not leave clothing outside the clothing boxes.
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
